



CHANNEL MAINTENANCE PLAN

Public Scoping Meetings

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the lower Columbia River ports of Longview, Kalama, Woodland, Vancouver and Portland are conducting a joint environmental review to aid in developing a plan to ensure that the Lower Columbia River Federal Navigation Channel is maintained and operational for another 20 years. The Channel Maintenance Plan will include actions to manage dredged material while considering the natural resources of the river. With this Plan, the Corps, these Sponsor Ports, federal and state agencies, other ports and stakeholders will better understand what needs to be done—and do it well—to ensure a reliable deep-draft navigation channel.

The Corps and Sponsor Ports will evaluate environmental effects and plan alternatives, including ways to reduce dredging requirements, in an environmental impact statement and will select a management plan based on this analysis.

Scoping is an opportunity early in the environmental review process to receive input from the public and stakeholders on issues to consider in the analysis of potential environmental impacts as evaluated under the National Environmental Policy Act and Washington’s State Environmental Policy Act. Input also is sought on alternatives to include in the analysis.
