Wetland A	0.47	acre(s)	(b)(1) Non-adjacent wetland.	This wetland is excluded as a non-adjacent wetland. Based on a desktop review of the site and agent supplied information (maps, figures, and datasheets), the review area contains a 0.47 acres depressional wetland located with a vegetated area on the eastern boundary of the parcel. The western portion of the site consists of a paved parking lot and driveway. The wetland identified on site does not directly abut an (a)(1) - (a)(3) water as it is surrounded by uplands that are higher in elevation. This wetland is not inundated by flooding from an (a)(1) - (a)(3) water in a typical year or separated from an (a)(1) - (a)(3) water only by a natural feature. Furthermore, this wetland is not separated from an (a)(1) - (a)(3) water only by an artificial structure allowing a direct hydrologic surface connection between the wetlands and the (a)(1) - (a)(3) water in a typical year. The next closest off-site aquatic feature (Cow Creek) is separated from the wetland within the review area by uplands, multiple railroads, and roadways. The wetland extends off-site to the east and is confined by the railroad tracks. According to site visit notes, the agent identified a small culvert beneath the railroad outside the south eastern corner of the parcel. However, due to steep sloping along the eastern and southern boundary of the site associated with the railroad and roadway, no potential connections to Cow Creek were identified. Aerial imagery and Google Street View images support this determination.
