NRCS soil maps show no predominantly hydric soils within the Review Area. A review of historic aerial imagery, DOGAMI LIDAR, and site photographs supports the conclusion that this ditch was constructed in uplands to manage stormwater from State Highway 62. Based on the historical images, the ditch was constructed between 1939 and 1959. Ditch 1 was constructed in uplands or in non-jurisdictional waters, and is excluded water feature pursuant to the Navigable Waters Protection Rule (NWPR).

A review of historic aerial imagery, DOGAMI LIDAR, and site photographs supports the conclusion that this ditch was likely constructed in uplands to manage stormwater from State Highway 62. Based on the historical images, the ditch was constructed between 1939 and 1959. Ditch 2 was constructed in uplands or in non-jurisdictional waters, and is excluded water feature pursuant

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		to the Navigable Waters Protection Rule

The delineation included site photos, historic aerial photographs, vegetation and soil surveys, and site plans that provide sufficient documentation to assess the review area under the Navigable Waters Protection Rule (NWPR).
