Wetland	0.13	acre(s)	(b)(1) Non-adjacent wetland.	Wetland lies in the northern portion of the Review Area. This wetland does not directly abut an (a)(1)-(a)(3) water as it is surrounded by uplands. Wetland is not inundated by flooding in a typical year nor separated from an (a)(1)-(a)(3) water only by a natural feature. Furthermore, this wetland is not separated from an (a)(1)-(a)(3) water only by an artificial structure allowing a direct hydrologic surface connection between the wetlands and the (a)(1)-(a)(3) water in a typical year. Wetland does not meet the definition of an adjacent wetland under the NWPR.	
Ditch 1	0.01	acre(s)	(b)(5) Ditch that is not an (a)(1) or (a)(2) water, and those portions of a ditch constructed in an (a)(4) water that do not satisfy the conditions of (c)(1).	Ditch 1 lies in the northern portion of the Review Area. The ditch is 2-3 feet wide and 100 feet north to south. Ditch 1 is not considered a tributary under (a)(2) because at the time the ditch was originally constructed, the ditch did not relocate a tributary, was not constructed in a tributary, and was not constructed in an adjacent wetland. Therefore, the ditch meets the (b)(5) exclusion pursuant to the NWPR.	
Ditch 2	0.004	acre(s)	(b)(5) Ditch that is not an (a)(1) or (a)(2) water, and those portions of a ditch constructed in an (a)(4) water that do not satisfy the conditions of (c)(1).	Ditch 2 lies in the northwestern portion of the Review Area. The ditch is two feet wide and 50 feet east to west. Ditch 1 is not considered a tributary under (a)(2) because at the time the ditch was originally constructed, the ditch did not relocate a tributary, was not constructed in a tributary, and was not constructed in an adjacent wetland. Therefore, the ditch meets the (b)(5) exclusion pursuant to the NWPR.	
Ditch 3	0.002	acre(s)	(b)(5) Ditch that is not an (a)(1) or (a)(2) water, and those portions of a ditch constructed in an (a)(4) water that do not satisfy the conditions of (c)(1).	Ditch 3 lies in the eastern portion of the Review Area. The ditch is 1-2 feet wide and 30 feet east to west. Ditch 1 is not considered a tributary under (a)(2) because at the time the ditch was originally constructed, the ditch did not relocate a tributary, was not constructed in a tributary, and was not constructed in an adjacent wetland. Therefore, the ditch meets the (b)(5) exclusion pursuant to the NWPR.
