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Safety

CRITERIA FOR AWARD OF USACE SAFETY AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH
COIN AND PIN
IN THE NORTHWESTERN DIVISION

1. PURPOSE. This circular states the recommended criteria that commanders should use for awarding the USACE Safety and Occupational Health coin and pin.
2. APPLICABILITY. This circular is applicable to the entire Northwestern Division.
3. DISTRIBUTION. This circular is approved for public release; distribution is unlimited.
4. REFERENCE. AR 672-20, Incentive Awards.
5. CRITERIA.

a. Criteria for award of Safety and Occupational Health Coin are (Obverse and converse sides with different designs; 1 5/8 inch diameter; brass-type of metal):

(1) The government employee (GE) provided a quality report with value added recommendations to the Commander as a team member serving on a Board of Investigation.

(2) The GE served as an individual or team member working to seek out and implement new and innovative methods to conduct a hazardous work activity more safely and efficiently.

(3) The GE was responsible for saving life or preventing incapacitating injury of a co-worker, contractor employee or member of the public, such as giving CPR or first aid to a severely injured person.

(4) The GE or contractor employee (CE) implemented an innovative idea, work method, etcetera, which will significantly reduce risk and enhance safety and/or occupational health.

(5) The GE or CE developed an equivalent safety and/or occupational health precaution or procedure that enhanced safety while saving time and/or money.

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(6) The CEs worked 350,000 hours or more without a lost workday accident.
($200,000/350,000=0.57$)

b. Criteria for Award of Safety and Occupational Health Pin are (Obverse side same design as coin; converse side has pin mechanism; 1 inch diameter; brass-type metal):

(1) The GE accomplished yearly update of resident office/operating project activity hazard analyses and safety plan.

(2) The GE showed a specific insight regarding:

(a) Discovering a safety problem or deficiency.

(b) Documenting a safety problem or deficiency.

(c) Correcting a safety problem or deficiency.

(3) GE identified significant hazard and took action to have it eliminated.


(4) GE provided an effective and innovative response to a safety and/or occupational health event.

(5) CEs worked 250,000 hours or more without a lost workday accident.
($200,000/250,000=0.80$)

(6) GE discovered and reported significant findings during investigations while assigned as the action person for a report of survey involving a safety and/or occupational health event.

(7) GE served as an aggressive and functioning safety officer for the resident office/operating project for at least one year.
