<b>Dredging and Disposal and Wildlife Mitigation Sites (including wetlands)</b>	<p><b>Construction:</b> Prepare plans and specifications, and advertise and award contracts for the construction of general navigation features (i.e., dredging, disposal and construction of mitigation features)</p> <p>Under contract to the Corps, the contractor will be responsible to prepare the upland disposal sites to receive construction material</p> <p>Contribute 75% of the contract cost (including all change orders and contract modifications) for construction</p> <p><b>Maintenance:</b> Maintain the Federal navigation project after construction</p> <p>Dredging and disposal will be financed 100% by the federal government, except where the sponsors have made changes from the governments' least cost plan</p> <p>Maintain the Federal mitigation sites in perpetuity after construction</p>	<p><b>Pre-construction:</b> Enter into a signed Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA) with the Corps of Engineers before construction commences</p> <p>Hold and save the Government harmless except through the negligence of Corps contractor</p> <p>Secure all lands, easements including dredged material disposal sites and mitigation sites necessary for construction</p> <p>Give the government the right to enter land owned or controlled by the sponsor</p> <p>Perform any investigations for hazardous substances that the Corps determines necessary under CERCLA at upland disposal sites</p> <p>Assume complete financial responsibility of any cleanup under CERCLA</p> <p>Comply with the Uniform Relocations Assistance and Real Estate Acquisition Policies</p> <p>Comply with all Federal and State laws and regulations</p>	<p><b>USFWS and NMFS:</b> Issue biological opinions for the project (done May 2002)</p> <p><b>USEPA:</b> Section 102 designation of the Deep Water ocean disposal site</p>

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<b>Dredging and Disposal and Wildlife Mitigation Sites (including wetlands)</b>	Authorized to make a lump sum payment to ODFW and WDFW to fulfill the Government's responsibility to operate and maintain mitigation areas.	<p><b>Construction:</b> Contribute 25% of the actual contract cost (including all change orders and contract modifications) of construction</p> <p>Pay the incremental cost increase to place material at the Lonestar gravel pit and the added cost to construct the upper river in a different manner than the government's plan</p> <p>The sponsors may choose to construct from CRM 95 to the upstream end of the project, utilizing Corps of Engineers specifications and under Corps' direction</p> <p><b>Maintenance:</b> Operate, maintain and manage disposal facilities located on sponsor port property according to Corps' specifications after Corps' contractor has prepared the sites to receive construction material and placed the dredged material</p> <p>Furnish a dredge to the Corps on a cost reimbursement basis to assist in maintenance of the federal navigation channel under Corps' specifications and direction</p> <p>Operate and maintain local service facilities, provide berthing areas, floats, piers, and slips, and shoreline facilities required for ports (port facilities are not part of project)</p>	

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<b>Environmental Restoration</b>	<p><b>Construction:</b> Prepare plans and specifications, and advertise and award contracts for construction of ecosystem restoration projects, including dredging and placement of dredge material, tidegate retrofits, etc. Contribute 65% of the contract cost (including all change orders and contract modifications) for construction</p> <p><b>Maintenance:</b> Contribute 65% of cost of post construction monitoring of restoration sites</p>	<p><b>Construction:</b> Provide 35% of the contract cost including all change orders and contract modifications Provide lands and easements necessary for restoration features</p> <p><b>Maintenance:</b> Maintain and operate restoration features for specified periods Provide 35% cost share for post construction monitoring of restoration sites</p>	<p><b>USWFS:</b> Translocate Columbian White Tail Deer (CWTD) and monitor the CWTD Complete the Federal process to change the purpose of the Julia Butler Hansen Wildlife Refuge at Tenasillahe after the de-listing of CWTD Perform any subsequent dredging of Bachelor Slough</p>
