Biography



Davis Moriuchi is the Deputy District Engineer for Project Management and the Chief of the Planning, Programs and Project Management Division.

In his position, Moriuchi provides District leadership in establishing and maintaining processes to manage scope, quality, cost, budgets and schedules of all projects under the project management system. He manages and directs all civil works programs management activities, including program and budget development, preparation for Congressional testimony, oversight of program execution, and reprogramming actions. Further, he is responsible for all civil works planning functions for the District, including plan formulation, economics, and environmental resources.

He joined the Corps in 1974, and has served as the Chief of the Environmental and Natural Resources branches, Chief of the Evaluation branch (Plan formulation and Economics), Acting Chief of Planning Division, Special Assistant to the Chief of Construction Division for Environmental Affairs, and Acting Regional Regulatory Administrator. He has served in his present position since 1988.

Moriuchi was born in Tokyo, Japan, and graduated from Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon with a bachelor's degree in history in 1973. He received his master's degree in public administration from Lewis & Clark in 1983. He completed the Senior Executive Fellows program at Harvard University in 1996.

He is an active member of the Society of American Military Engineers, where he is a member of the Academy of Fellows. He is currently an arbitration panel member for the Oregon State Bar Association, and has served in a variety of voluntary leadership positions for various educational and non-profit organizations in the Portland area.
